

Preliminary Single Subject Credential Program

(Authorization to teach up to five years in a high school or middle school mathematics classroom)

Subject Matter Competency Program in Mathematics (59-60 units)

- Can be taken at any time before initial student teaching (EHD155A), allow at least 2 years.
- GPA: at least 2.67 overall GPA or at least 2.75 in last 60 units.
- Passing **ALL** three parts of the CSET Subject Matter Mathematics exams waives this program. (Passing CSET scores must be used for satisfying subject matter competency within five years of the test date).

- Courses must be completed with no grade lower than a "C," including the U.S. Constitution course for the US constitution requirement.
- Professional preparation courses must be completed no more than ten (10) years prior to credential application (not program application).
