Financial Benefits

- Receive \$1,000 per year, for up to two years through *Mathematics and Science Teacher Initiative* (MSTI).
- Receive \$500 per year, for up to two years for professional memberships, conference attendance, professional development activity participation (MSTI).
- Receive \$350 towards tuition for the summer Calculus I class for those who need it.
- Paid experience working with K-12 students through the Teaching Fellows Scholarship Program; students can earn \$700 per month.
- Eligibility for an annual Scholarship of \$1,250 awarded in the spring semester of the freshman year and renewable up to three years through Teaching Fellows Scholarship Program.
- Qualify for \$3,750 per year through the Federal TEACH Grant Program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Be a first-time freshman student in Fall 2024
- Interested in becoming a middle or high school mathematics teacher
- Minimum 3.5 high school GPA
- Must have taken Calculus in high school and received a grade of C or better
