



A Commitment to Research

Fresno State's Department of Psychology is highly active in research and consists of a large body of faculty experts in a diverse array of psychological subfields. From neuropsychology to computational modeling of human behavior to the effects of family dynamics on student success, our faculty have a wide reach, regularly publishing in peer-reviewed journals and presenting their results in venues with national and international scope. Due to Bob's leadership as a former department chair and dedicated student mentor, the department remains committed to engaging students in the research programs of our faculty as much as possible.

To further cement his legacy as an avid supporter of student research, the **Bob Levine Memorial Travel** and **Research Award provides a mechanism for students to offset some of the financial costs of participating in the research process**, whether it be for equipment, participant reimbursement, and/or travel to regional, national, or international conferences to present the results of their hard work.

Participation in the research process is recognized as a "High Impact Practice" that offers an extraordinary, hands-on opportunity for our students to engage with fields and career paths they may not have previously considered. In addition, these experiences allow students to work in small groups, often 1:1, with faculty mentors. Receiving support for their travel to conferences provides students with opportunities to engage with a broad network of experts in their fields of interest and helps them make connections that can later be helpful while applying to doctoral degree programs. Such experiences are invaluable to students who represent the future of our field, especially for those who are primarily the first in their families to attend college, and/or have been historically underrepresented in STEM.

Student Impact


Since the award's inception, 23 promising students have been supported in their travel to conferences both nationally and globally. Each of these students has authored a conference presentation highlighting their research work, often listed as the highly prestigious "first author," typically signifying that the individual made the most substantial contribution to the research.
